
Patchworking and Quilting with Vlieseline®: Discover Variety!

Which patchwork interlining for which purpose?

Vlieseline patchwork interlinings are available for 90°/45° patchwork designs or those with 60° designs. For 90°/45° designs, such as the classical block, Quickscreen or Quilt 90 are especially suitable. For 60° designs, such as the babyblock and star, Quickscreen Triangle or Quilt 60 are used.

First select your pattern and then decide whether the interlining is to be firmly connected with the fabric after sewing or whether you would like to tear it away afterwards. The patchwork top will be given more stability by sewing **Quickscreen** and **Quickscreen** and **Quickscreen** Triangle firmly to the fabric. This is especially advantageous for wall hangings, floor cushions and bags.

However, if you would like to have just the fabric after sewing, you should select **Quilt 90** or **Quilt 60.** They are perforated by sewing and removed after the top is finished, which proves advantageous for clothing or soft quilts.


As the seams are subjected to more stress due to the tearing away when using Quilt 90 and Quilt 60, the beginning and the end of the seam have to be fixed with backstitching.


How to work with patchwork interlinings for 90°/45° designs: Quickscreen or Quilt 90

Preparation: Cut the patchwork interlining to the size of the finished block and add 1 cm seam allowance on each side. Cut the fabric strips to desired finished width – plus 1 cm seam allowance on each side.

If you need centre pieces in your design, cut them to size also adding a seam allowance.







- (1) Place the first piece with the right side facing up (according to the pattern) onto the **unprinted** side of the patchwork interlining. Place the first fabric strip flush with the edges, **right side on right side**, and secure it with pins. Set the edge guide of the sewing machine at a distance of 2 cm and sew the two fabric pieces together, making sure that the guiding edge runs **exactly** on one of the pre-printed lines at a distance of 2 cm from the seam.
- 2 Flip the fabric strip over, cut according to the pattern and press flat. Then place the next strip of fabric, right sides together, secure with pins and wes, together in the same way as the first one, then flip over and cut.
- 3 Continue clockwise until the block is completed.


Finishing: Cut the individual blocks accurately to size again, leaving a 1 cm seam allowance on all sides.


Now place the blocks right sides together according to the pattern and sew them together accurately following the pre-printed line and considering the seam allowance. Press the seam allowances and then sew the strips together lengthwise.

Finally the patchwork is lined with a Vlieseline Volume Fleece, quilted and then finished off with a backing fabric.

How to work with the patchwork interlinings for 60° patterns: Quickscreen Triangle or Quilt 60


Place the centre piece with the right side facing up onto the centre (or according to the pattern) of the **unprinted** side of the patchwork interlining.






Flip over again, open fabric strips and cut off along the line of the angle. Cut off the strips only after flipping over the strips again.

Pin the first fabric strip to the interlining, **right sides to-gether**, along the **broken** line.






Place the next strip right sides together along the broken line and secure with pins. Flip over and sew on along the solid line.

Flip over and sew the fabric strips together along the solid line.





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Turn over again, flip the strip over and cut off along the line of the angle. Carry on until the diamond is completed.

Finishing: Cut off the individual diamonds precisely along the broken line.

For the star, sew together two halves consisting of three diamonds, always placing the diamonds right side on right side and sewing them together precisely along the solid line. Connect the two halves by a vertical seam.

Leave the outer seam allowances open. So the star can be either finished with a backing or another diamond can be added to obtain a hexagon.

Line the finished quilt with a Vlieseline Volume Fleece and finish with a backing.

Working with free patterns

For free patterns, the unprinted **Vlieseline Stitch'n Tear** embroidery stabiliser can be used. The patterns are either transferred or freely drawn. Place the fabrics on the unmarked side of the interlining and then sew on the backline along the drawn lines. After finishing the quilt, remove the embroidery interlining.

Working with very delicate fabrics

Very delicate fabrics which may be easily distorted during cutting or sewing can be fused with **Vlieseline H 180 or Vlieseline G 785**. This very delicate and lightweight interlining maintains the character of the fabrics while ensuring neat processing results.



Appliqués

If you wish to combine patchwork with appliqué, **Vliesofix®** is the ideal solution. **Vliesofix®** is a soft adhesive web attached to a release paper used to make fabrics fusible, thus allowing distortion free and accurate appliqué work.
